Hydrant Meter Agreement & Operating Instructions

Permittee is authorized to draw water from public (yellow) hydrants within the City of North Las Vegas (CNLV) water system using the CNLV issued hydrant meter, and is responsible for payment of all water usage recorded through the meter. Water service will be provided in accordance with the CNLV Utilities Department Service Rules and Regulations. Failure to comply with any of the permit provisions, including account delinquency, will be cause for immediate permit termination, and removal of hydrant meter. Meter tampering will result in a fine of \$2,500.00 and/or arrest and prosecution to the full extent of the law. Meters determined by CNLV to be unrepairable due to Permittee negligence will be replaced at Permittee's sole cost. In the event the meter is no longer recording water use accurately, usage may be estimated by CNLV and Permittee is responsible for payment of estimated consumption.

Hydrant meters are for temporary use, not to exceed one year, and are not to be used in lieu of a permanent water service.

Permittee agrees that:

1. Hydrant meter use is solely permitted within the City of North Las Vegas (CNLV) water service area boundaries and within the public right of way. To use newly installed hydrants, prior authorization from developer must be obtained.
2. Permittee shall inform CNLV if hydrant meter will be attached to any underground piping and/or if at any time a hose/pipe 50' or longer will be used. In such cases a backflow device will be attached to the hydrant meter. Backflow test ports and valves are solely for device certification.
3. Using only a fire hydrant/spanner wrench, slowly turn on fire hydrant valve until completely opened. Failure to open or close the hydrant completely will cause extensive underground damage. Failing to use the appropriate wrench will cause damage to the hydrant operating components.
4. Do not leave the fire hydrant or hydrant meter in the open position or pressurized while unattended or overnight.
5. Fill hoses for water trucks must be **disconnected** from the hydrant meter between uses.
6. Fill hoses attached to tanks are to be continuous with no additional fittings/couplings. The ONLY exception is the allowance of "Y" adapters for joining dual hoses to tanks.
7. Permittee is responsible for obtaining a barricade plan from Public Works, if hydrant use will impede the natural flow of traffic, including pedestrian use. Hoses are not permitted to cross roadway.
8. Observe meter operation regularly and if found leaking or non-functioning report it to CNLV immediately for investigation and repair. Water waste may result in fines. Ensure all connections are tight with hoses in good condition.
9. Failure to comply with any of the above provisions may result in fines, damage/repair fees and/or removal of hydrant meter.

Permittee accepts full responsibility and will be billed for all damages to CNLV facilities, public/private property including but not limited to, the fire hydrant, meter, valve, lateral, backflow, mains and appurtenances related thereto. If final cost to repair or replace damaged or missing facilities exceeds the deposit amount, Permittee agrees to pay the difference within 21 days of invoice.

In the event a hydrant meter is approved for mobile use, Permittee is subject to above regulations and will be required to provide monthly meter readings, location, and contact person to CNLV on the 28th day of each month. Failure to do so will result in a \$250.00 fine for each month without read submission. Meter must be made available for inspection/ return when requested and is not to be mounted to a vehicle. Water may NOT be drawn using this meter from any other area water systems (Las Vegas Valley Water District, Henderson, etc.). In the event a meter is lost/stolen, Permittee must file a police report, submit it to CNLV, and will be subject to a \$2,500.00 fine.

Permittee agrees to abide by all conditions set forth above & will ensure all operators are trained prior to using a hydrant meter.
